KAREN SHETTERLEY RECEIVES NATIONAL RECOGNITION

K aren Shetterley, Ph.D., Department of Grants & Contracts, was recently selected as one of 24 individuals nationally to participate in the 2006 Supporting Teachers, Strengthening Families National Leadership Program. The program is funded by the Doris Duke Charitable Foundation and is sponsored by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC).

This year's initiative is to engage the early childhood community in preventing child abuse and neglect, promoting children's healthy social and emotional development, and supporting families. Karen will participate in professional development opportunities in Florida and Texas and will receive \$1,000 to support the development of an action plan to be implemented in Georgia.



In addition, Karen was appointed to the NAEYC Professional Education Review Panel. The panel advises NAEYC professional development staff and evaluates materials prepared for four-year and graduatehigher education degree institutions submitting Early Childhood Program Reports for accreditation review. Karen will begin her three-year term of service by attending three days of training in Washington, D.C. this month.


Mostrecently,Professional & Personal Development staff launched several very successful English language training programs for the Georgia Center housekeeping staff and
